

## "One of Kalamazoo's Artistic Gems"


Kalamazoo holds the unique distinction of being home to one of the nation's longeststanding, small professional modern dance companies. Celebrating its 43nd year in 2023. Wellspring/Cori Terry & Dancers, hails from a distinct lineage of pioneer modern dance companies. In the early years of her career, Wellspring's founder, Cori Terry, studied and performed across the world with the Erick Hawkins Dance Company. This experience and the training she received firmly established her among an elite group of nationally acclaimed professional dancers. With the vision of one day starting her own company, Ms. Terry left the Hawkins company to serve as an artist in residence at Western Michigan University. A year later, in 1981, Wellspring/Cori Terry & Dancers was established and has since introduced thousands to the art of dance. enriched the Kalamazoo Arts community through collaborations with other professional artists and has become a platform for advancing postmodern dance choreography.

Today Wellspring continues this legacy as a modern dance producer, presenter, and educator.

- Its fall and spring concerts, featuring works choreographed by Ms. Terry, members of the company, and guest artists, see annual audiences of 300-500 individuals.
- Nationally acclaimed performers and master teachers travel to Kalamazoo to perform and participate in Wellspring's annual Midwest Regional Alternative Dance Festival (RAD Fest), now celebrating its 12th year.
- Adult and youth dance classes are taught throughout the year and offer area

- dance students one of the community's only opportunities to study with working professional dancers.
- Educational outreach programs such as ABCDance, a prior partnership with KRESA's HeadStart, and our new program Ready Movers, a partnership with KC Ready4s, offer unique programs that aid with early literacy development and stress management using movement, stories, and music.

The company and its members' highly respected reputations are evidenced by regular invitations to perform at dance festivals and events around the country. Some of the most recent highlights include critically acclaimed performances and collaborations with the Kalamazoo Symphony Orchestra, the Red Sea Pedestrians, Bill Ryan and the GVSU New Music Ensemble, and Kalamazoo Institute of Arts.





### RAD FEST DANCE MAKER BIOGRAPHIES

#### 2023/2024 RADicle Artist Amanda Ramirez

(she/her) is a **Chicago**-based dancer, director. and choreographer who creates genre-bending performance works centered around her Chicana culture. Ramirez is a graduate of Texas Tech University and has performed and presented original choreographic works spanning from modern-contemporary, improvisation, salsa, and flamenco.

She's a grant recipient of Women Who Create, Cliff Dwellers and a resident/fellow of Chicago Cultural Center, Links Hall CO-Missions. The Croft, See Chicago Dance and more. She's directed, choreographed and produced several evening length shows and is currently in postproduction for her first dance film, "Tierra", which she directed, produced, and choreographed. Ambo Dance Theatre (Louisville, KY) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit arts organization and modern dance company under the direction of Amberly M. Simpson. Our work is often interdisciplinary in nature, combining elements from theatre, film, photography, and visual arts to create works that touch on social issues and the human condition.

Using a collaborative model for creation. Ambo Dance Theatre not only presents the unique voice of the choreographer, but also the direct input and movement vocabulary of the dancers themselves to create innovative, integrative, and original modern dance works that unify a variety of perspectives on complex topics.

Led by Artistic Director **Amy Wilson, Dance** in the Annex (DITA) produces live, dance-film works and site-specific events with an emphasis on process. DITA was conceived in 2009, curating a master class series led by local and national quest artists for dance professionals. DITA has produced numerous performances in **Grand Rapids** and beyond. DITA has performed at RAD Fest, Sidewalk Detroit and Kristi Faulkner Dance, DITA's award winning screendance work has been presented in dance film festivals around the globe, including ScreenDance International (Detroit), Monza Film Festival and Reale Film Festival (Italy).

Anna Bauer and Jairus Carr are dancers and choreographers living in Austin. Texas. They dance for the Kathy Dunn Hamrick Dance Company while producing their own work, Anna and Jairus began collaborating in 2022. Their pieces have performed at events across Texas: Texas Dance Improvisation Festival, Barnstorm Dance Fest, Austin Dance Festival, and Aimed Dance Summer Fest. In 2023, they travelled to Washington to reset a duet on the artists of Bellingham Repertory Dance for their fall show Doubles. Anna and Jairus are trying their bestthey also make coffee, read books, and hold hands.

Ballet Folklorico de Mi Tierra is a folklorico dance group that was formed by El Concilio in 2018. With the idea of creating a space for youth to explore their cultural heritage through dance. The group can be seen performing a variety of traditional folklorico dances from places like Jalisco, Chipas, Sinaloa, and Veracruz. With the commitment of the youth and the support of parents/staff, Ballet Folklorico de Mi Tierra can be found performing at different community events across Kalamazoo & Southwest Michigan.

**Brynne Billingsley** works at the intersection of creative and healing arts. A **New Yorker** since 2003, her choreography has been presented by Dragon's Egg, Women in Motion, Center for Performance Research, Triskelion Arts, Soaking WET Festival, Chashama Gallery, NYU Skirball Center, Dumbo Dance Festival, Joyce Soho/ Performance Mix Festival, Northside Festival, and Bushwick Open Studios Festival. Brynne has collaborated with Chris Elam/Misnomer Dance Theater, Jody Oberfelder, Murray Spalding, and Biork among other artists. She holds an M.F.A. from Hollins University and is the owner of Progressive Pilates Williamsburg, a renowned center for somatic education and healing.

Chloe Ilene Misner is a movement-maker and dance educator based in **South Bend. IN**. She is the Artistic Director of New Industry Dance and a full-time dance educator at Clay High School. Chloe has trained in modern, ballet, West African. and improvisation, among various other styles. Her approach to movement as investigative physical research is what inspires choreographic choices and creative concepts. Chloe holds a dual B.A. in Anthropology and French, with a minor in Dance; she is currently pursuing a Master's in Education.

Christa Smutek is the Artistic Director of Artistic Edge Dance Centre, Director of the in-studio intensive, The Collective Movement, and Founder of her project based dance company, Smutek Dance. Christa studied at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor and received her B.S. in Movement Science from the School of Kinesiology. Christa established Smutek Dance, in 2019 and have performed at numerous festivals throughout the country. Most recently, Christa was honored to be one of eight choreographers selected for the Ann & Weston Hicks Choreography Fellowship at Jacob's Pillow, under the direction of Risa Steinberg and Dianne McIntvre.

Claire Little graduated from Oakland University with a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance Performance and was the recipient of the O'Dowd Scholar in Dance in 2019. Claire has worked with Jodie Randolph Dance, and accepted an apprenticeship with Eisenhower

Dance Detroit in 2019. Claire has also been a company member with ConteXture Dance Detroit for the last 3 years! In 2019, she received the Maggie Allesee choreography award and produced the show "All the Things I Wish I'd Say... but Won't." This year Claire produced another show titled "Isolada" as a fundraiser to fund her missions schooling in Mexico!

Claire Porter / PORTABLES (www.cportables. com) is a series of solos and small group works that adapt to a variety of spaces, from theaters to telephone booths. Included are the award winning NAMELY, MUSCLES, a poetic enactment of all the muscles of the body and then some, seen at conferences, festivals, medical schools. Her PORTABLES are a changing series selected from repertory that have toured Europe, Korea, India, and USA. Her current project, GRAMMAR SHORTS, is a seriously silly ride through English Grammar, Sentenced to Sentences is one of these stories.

ConteXture Dance Detroit is a non-profit dance company based in Detroit, that was founded in 2014 by artistic director. Tracv Halloran. It is a contemporary modern dance company that is interested in exploring cultural identity and the relationship between artistic expression and the human condition. Its concert works examine themes within human relationships in order to begin a dialogue on why and how we are connected to each other.

ConteXture's mission, as part of the burgeoning arts explosion in the city, is to explore and expand the urban dance identity of Detroit. Through advanced training and performance opportunities, ConteXture has developed a local corps of professional dancers in an effort to establish Detroit a nationally recognized center of dance.

Elijah (Eli) Motley, a North Carolina-based choreographer, dancer, and educator, holds an MFA in Dance from UNC Greensboro and a dual BA/BS from Old Dominion University. His own work has been commissioned and presented at festivals and universities across the U.S. Currently. Eli serves as an assistant professor at Elon University.

**Embodied Arts Collective** is a pre-professional dance company based in Michigan. Artistic Director, Ari Mokdad is a Detroit-born choreographer, writer, and educator. She attended GVSU where she received three BA degrees in Dance, Writing, and English. Ari completed her MA and doctoral studies at Wayne State University and her MFA from Warren Wilson College.

Erika 'Red' Stowall is an educator, dancer and choreographer residing in **Detroit**, MI. Red graduated from University of Michigan School of Music Theatre and Dance with a Bachelor in Fine Arts. She is a recipient of the Kresge Artist Fellowship, Applebaum's Emerging Artist Award as well as Fulbright Hays GPA Study Abroad grant, awarded through the University of Detroit Mercy.

Red uses her classical training combined with her background in West African dance, as the foundation of her work. Many of her works explores her real life experiences navigating being a black woman in society. Her work is based on positive portrayal of Black stories and advocating for Black women's voices. Red sees dance as a calling and is passionate about creating performance pieces, which invite conversation on safe spaces for Women of Color, restoration and positive narrative/images of Black communities. She is currently the dance teacher at Martin Luther King High School, in Detroit, her alma mater. Red is the founder and current Artistic Director of Big Red Wall Dance Company. The company has been active since 2011.

Eva Green is a citizen of the Cherokee Nation of Oklahoma and is a business major student at Snow College. She has been training in artistic dymnastics for over ten years with Dan and Janna Coleman, Ron Bunting, and Melanie Wysong. She is the winner of over 7 first-place Utah state titles and one regional title in competitive gymnastics. Eva also studied movement improvisation with Dmitri Peskov and is a current member of the Snow College Dance Company. She has appeared in dance works by Breann Birmingham, Maren Rodgers, Robert Cox and Tylee Coates.

**Hannah Seidel** is an Associate Professor of Dance at **Grand Valley State University** whose research interests lie at the intersections of play, improvisation, and the therapeutic aspects of movement. She served as a faculty member at West Chester University, Northampton Community College, and the University of Dayton. Jennifer is a founding member of the modern dance company, Abby Z and the New Utility performing at venues wellknown festivals and venues around the world. Their choreography has been presented at The American College Dance Association, and Cleveland Dance Fest, Detroit City Dance Festival.

Joanna Whitmyer (she/they) is a dancer and movement-maker from **Southwest Michigan** with a varied background in dance from ballet to ballroom. Joanna mainly focuses on their own internal expansion of their dancing while diving deeper into somatic movement and improvisational technique. They are a true believer in the power and resilience that can come from within the body. Joanna is a company artist, rehearsal director and collaborator with New Industry Dance Company based in South Bend, IN.

Joy and Aerick Burton are Move with Joy and Breakin' Ballet's Founders and Directors. Joy is a dancer, instructor, choreographer, freelancer, and owner of Move with Joy Studio in Kalamazoo, Ml. Joy graduated from EMU with a B.S. in Dance Performance in 2012, From 2010 to 2012 they performed with the modern dance company. People Dancing, directed by Christina Sears. Joy has been teaching dance and movement for 20 years.

Aerick is an artist, breaker, activist, cofounder of Move with Joy and director of Breakin' Ballet. Aerick's one of a kind origami installations and taxigami works have been featured in Art Prize 2018, and 2021. Aerick was also an original founder of Breaking group Kalamacrew and teaches breaking and origami at Move with Joy studio in Kalamazoo, Mi.

Kinnari Vora (Chicago) shares stories of universal human conditions through movement, meditation, and theatrical practices. Her contemporary works are rooted in Bharatanatyam (disciple of Sarmishtha Sarkar, India), various Indian folk dances, kalaripayattu martial arts and recently contemporary dance. With collaboration at its core, her works are guided communal healing rituals, ancestral wisdom and interconnectedness. Billingslev has shared her love for art, movement, and life in NYC since 2003. She is the owner/founder of Progressive Pilates Williamsburg. Her choreography has been presented by Dragon's Egg, The NYU Skirball Center, Joyce Soho/Performance Mix Festival. and many others. Freeh is a Twin Cities-based, three time McKnight Fellow recipient. She danced with the James Sewell Ballet, MN Ballet and MN Dance Theater and has choreographed across the country. Freeh holds teaching positions at St. Olaf College, the University of Minnesota, and most recently, as Visiting Assistant Professor at Hollins University.

Vitacca Ballet, founded in 2020 by Kelly Ann Vitacca, is a creation-driven repertoire company in the **Houston** area. The Young Dancers Initiative serves as a preprofessional program for high school students aspiring to pursue a career in dance. YDI offers professional contemporary training, performance experiences, mentorship, educational workshops. choreographic and teaching opportunities, and networking to those delving deeper into contemporary dance. Tailored for Michigan's emerging artists, YDI provides a distinctive approach to training and mentorship, with tracks in Performance, Training, or Mentorship, each flexibly catering to dancers' needs. Each track grants access to educational opportunities like open classes and workshops. The Performance Track extends beyond training, culminating in fall season performances and additional opportunities in the spring.

She is also a dance filmmaker and was the commissioned Artist with the Young Artist Platform of the China Dancers Association. Yukina Sato is a dancer, choreographer, and filmmaker. Currently serving as an Assistant Professor in Dance at the Department of Performing Arts at Minnesota State University Mankato. Her research focuses on locating cultural identity through embodied memories and geographical space.

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
