

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
"One of Kalamazoo's Artistic Gems"

In 1981, Wellspring/Cori Terry & Dancers was founded in Kalamazoo, Michigan, under the artistic direction of dancer/choreographer Cori Terry. As Southwest Michigan's only professional modern dance company, Wellspring offers a unique and diverse artistic voice not found elsewhere in the region. The company presents its critically-acclaimed, original choreography plus the work of award-winning guest artists, while serving the community through education, scholarships, and accessible events.

Wellspring is the proud torch-bearer of the *normative* method of dance, a style pioneered by Erick Hawkins as a foil to ballet and traditional dance education. This method is now considered one of the most influential developments in the art form. In the early years of her career, Cori Terry studied and performed all over the world with the Erick Hawkins Dance Company; this experience firmly established her among an elite group of nationally acclaimed professional dancers. Wellspring has built its 35-year history on this foundation of artistic excellence and historical ties to the most influential figures in dance.

Highlights of Wellspring's history include performances with leading names in the dance industry, such as Mathew Janczewski of Arena Dance Company in Minneapolis, New York's Christopher Williams, the Artichoke Dance Company of New York, Zephyr Dance of Chicago, and several years as guest artists for the Erick Hawkins centennial and the Hawkins/

Graham celebration at New York's 92nd Street Y. Musical collaborations include world-premiere choreography set to the music of Philip Glass and John Adams. performed by the Kalamazoo Symphony Orchestra, as well as performances with critically-acclaimed musicians such as the Grand Valley State University New Music Ensemble, Bruce Brubaker, eighth blackbird [sic], Cavani String Quartet, Opus 21, and the Red Sea Pedestrians. Local collaborations include work with Fontana Chamber Arts, the Irving S. Gilmore International Keyboard Festival, and the Kalamazoo Institute of Arts. In addition, Wellspring showcases regional choreographers and presents works of national guest dance artists through the Midwest Regional Alternative Dance Festival, which has experienced rapid growth in size and notoriety since its establishment in 2010.



Artist Biographies



Cori Terry (Artistic Director), Wellspring's founder and Artistic Director, was born in Brooklyn and attended the State University of New York at

Stony Brook before moving to New York City to complete her dance training. In 1974, she joined the Erick Hawkins Dance Company, performing and teaching throughout the US and Europe. She moved to Kalamazoo as Artist-in-Residence at Western Michigan University in 1980 and founded Wellspring in 1981. In 1987, she received Kalamazoo's coveted Community Medal of Arts. She completed a BA in dance from WMU in 1989 and has taught master classes there as well as throughout Michigan and the Midwest. In 2006, Ms. Terry was honored by Kalamazoo College as recipient in the first-ever Women In Town Awards, recognizing the achievements of local artists. Ms. Terry was awarded the 2008 Community Dance Advocacy Award from WMU's Partners in Dance for her outstanding contributions to the Greater Kalamazoo community, advancing the art of modern dance. She was a finalist for the 2008 Governor's Lifetime Achievement Award, To. date, she has choreographed more than 85 major works for Wellspring. Ms. Terry is a certified advanced Rolfer®, in practice since 1996.



Marisa Bianan (Associate Artistic Director) obtained her Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from Western Michigan University in April 2018.

Through her studies, Marisa had the privilege to work with choreographers including Jeremy Blair, Monigue Haley, Carolyn Pavlik, and Brendan Duggan. While at Western Michigan University, Marisa performed with Western Dance Project, a pre-professional dance company, from the years of 2015-2016 under the direction of Whitney Moncrief. In 2019, Marisa collaborated with Grand Rapids artist, Lauren Donahue, to present *Phased* at the 2019 Midwest RADFest. In March 2020, Marisa created a dynamic trio for Inaside, a Chicago-based Jazz Dance Company, which later premiered in July 2020 during Inaside's in-person/virtual hybrid concert. In Fall 2020, Marisa then premiered her new work. *from* the embers, and back again... in Wellspring's virtual Fall concert, and once again in Wellspring's live Spring concert. Currently, Marisa is creating a new work for Western Michigan's University first-year performance class, 2021-2022 will be Marisa's fourth season with Wellspring/Cori Terry & Dancers and she is eager to present her new choreographic work, Take Back the Sun, in the upcoming Fall concert.

Artist Biographies



Alexis Harris (Rehearsal Director) has been dancing with Wellspring since 1997, providing many opportunities to strengthen herself as a

performer, teacher, rehearsal director and choreographer. Ms. Harris holds a Bachelor's degree in Biomedical Sciences from Western Michigan University. She is a practicing licensed massage therapist, a certified clinical hypnotist and is currently completing an apprenticeship in contemplative, nature-based practices. Along with her work, Alexis loves spending time with her teenagers, Eli and Lily.



Emily McKee began dancing at the age of 5 in Kalamazoo and has since then competed at Steps Dance Center, Xtreme Dance Sports, West Michigan

Dance Center and performed with Ballet Arts Ensemble. Currently enrolled at Grand Valley State University, she is receiving her Bachelor of Arts degree where she has been studying contemporary, modern, west African, jazz and ballet. In recent achievements as a student, Emily's solo choreography was chosen by the professors as one of two senior pieces to be performed in the Spring Concert. She also was given the opportunity to perform in the 2017, 2018, and 2019 American College Dance Association shows. Emily is currently working as an intern for the Wellspring Dance Academy as well as a dance teacher for

Vicksburg Community Education Dance and Tumbling program. She is looking forward to her first season with Wellspring/Cori Terry and company.



Andrew Niedbala is a recent graduate of Hope College where he dual-majored in dance and civil engineering.

Originally from Sterling Heights,

Michigan, he began dancing at an early age and eventually made his way to Anita's Elite Dance Studio, where he danced for several years and gained opportunities to perform in Miami, Florida, and Branson, Missouri. While studying at Hope College, he also performed in Salt Lake City, Utah; Adelaide, Australia; and most recently, Paris, France. Andrew joined Wellspring in 2019.



Carolyn Pampalone Rabbers joined Wellspring in 2017. She has received her MFA in Dance at UArts and BFA as Presidential

Scholar in Dance from WMU. As an emerging choreographer, she is interested in spirituality, collaboration coalesced with improvisation and exploring permaculture in pedagogy and research creation approaches. Carolyn has worked in NYC, Miami, and LA dancing and acting both on stage and on camera. She can be seen as "Abby" in Moondance (2020) and has performed for Coldplay, Omi, Starbucks, Jockey Bra, Kaplan University,

Royal Caribbean, Celebrity Cruises, Diavolo EdCo, The Union Project, Clairobscur, LACDC, and Vox Lumiere. She has performed in works choreographed by Cori Terry, Erick Hawkins, Yvonne Rainer, Loïe Fuller, Gerald Arpino, Randy Duncan, and John Leher. Carolyn's time on camera has inspired her to develop her screendance work. CPR: Inhale Movement has been featured at Detroit City Dance Festival, RAD Fest, the KIA, Krasl Art Center, and various national and international festivals. She has recently developed the documentary series: Wellspring Through the Years. Carolyn has trained at the American Dance Festival and at OBOC studying Countertechnique from Anouk van Dijk. Carolyn has been selected as a researcher as part of Gracefool Collective and Yorkshire's Dance Transports and critically and phenomenologically investigates somatic healing practices and racial identity politics. Carolyn is part-time faculty with WMU's Dance Department. She is an ABT® Certified Teacher, who has successfully completed the ABT® Teacher Training Intensive in Pre-Primary through Level 7 & Partnering of the ABT® National Training Curriculum, an ISTD Contemporary affiliate teacher, Reiki and Yoga certified, and has co-authored "Ready Movers" a mindfulness, movement and literacy program for Kalamazoo County's Ready 4's program. She has taught for Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp, Wellspring Dance Academy, Citadel, Fusion Center for Dance, Berrien County Dancers and The Gabriella Foundation. She has recently published her work *Where Our Feet Touch The Earth*, where she shares and extends invitations into her movement research based in Michigan. https://www.blurb.com/b/10664192-where-our-feet-touch-the-earth.
